

### **British Museum (Natural History) Collections of Natural History Specimens and Drawings from the *Endeavour* Voyage of Captain Cook**

1768 - 1771

These collections of natural history specimens were made by Sir Joseph Banks and Daniel Solander, the naturalists on Captain James Cook's first voyage round the world. Banks employed the artist Sydney Parkinson to make detailed watercolor drawings of the animals and plants collected. Specimens and drawings from Australia, Brazil, Java, Madeira, New Zealand, Society Islands and Tierra del Fuego are included in this unusual microfiche collection which contains around 1,000 botanical specimens, over 300 zoological drawings, both watercolor and pencil and over 1,500 botanical drawings and related engravings. This 23-volume title was published in Paris by F. Schoell in 1805-1834. Between 1799 and 1804 Alexander von Humboldt and Aime Jacques Alexandre Goujaud (referred to as Bonpland) made their celebrated expedition to central and northern South America and Cuba. They recorded the physical geography, weather, botany, zoology and general ecology of these regions. Since no complete set exists in North America, this microfilm edition was assembled from several sources.

1596 - 1900

### *OmniSys World Literature Collections (OWL)*

This collection contains books and pamphlets, histories and official documents and reports, as well as tour guides, personal memoirs, travel journals and diaries. Although the majority of the materials date from the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the collection includes material from the periods of European discovery and exploration (such as *The Discoverie of the Large, Rich and Bevvtiful* , (1596), Sir Walter Raleigh) and many publications from the early to mid 20<sup>th</sup> century. Sample titles include: Evans, Albert S., *Our Sister Republic: A Gala Trip through Tropical Mexico in 1869-1870* (1870); Palmer, Frederick, *Central America and its Problems* (1910); and Acosta, José de [1539-1600], *Historia natural y moral de las Indias, escrita por el p. Joseph de Acosta, de la Compañía de Jesús, Madrid* (1894). Writers include explorers, scientists, academics, diplomats, missionaries, archaeologists and private citizens. Materials cover Mexico, Latin America, the Caribbean and occasionally California.

## Manuscript Maps Relating to North America and the West Indies in British Repositories\*

1760 - 1783

The years 1760-1783 mark the apogee of British mapping in North America. Maps and plans at various scales were accepted as indispensable adjuncts to both the civil functions of colonial administration and to military needs for fortification, strategic planning and troop movement. Many of the maps surviving these decades were commissioned by the Crown and not only exemplify the development of cartography during the Enlightenment, but also provide a record, sometimes unique, of the events and places to which they relate.

## Walker, William. Callender I. Fayssoux Collection of William Walker Papers

1856 - 1860

William Walker - doctor, lawyer, journalist, politician and adventurer - was the most famous of the American filibusters as well as one of the most controversial figures in Central-American history. In the mid-1800s, Walker led armed expeditions into Mexico, Nicaragua and Honduras, despite the fact that the United States was at peace with these countries. From Tulane University's Latin-American Library, this collection of 478 items consists of the papers of Callender I. Fayssoux, who was Walker's aide de camp and also served him variously as Paymaster, Purchasing Agent, Naval Commander and Minister General of the Republic of Nicaragua. This collection contains the only papers in existence covering Walker's activities. Walker's expeditions, especially in Nicaragua, gave rise to vehement anti-Americanism in Central America. For this reason, historians interested in Central America and its relationship to the United States will find here essential background information. In addition, scholars of the 19<sup>th</sup> century doctrine of Manifest Destiny will find a valuable resource in this collection.

## **The Heartman Manuscript Collection at Xavier University Library, New Orleans: Manuscripts on Slavery\***

1724 - 1897

The Xavier University of New Orleans, the only Black Catholic Institute of Higher Education in the United States, possesses in its library a substantial collection of manuscripts relating to the North American slave trade during the period 1724-1897, including important documents from New Orleans dating from 1803 to early Reconstruction. Built up over 20 years by Charles F. Heartman, a Mississippi book-dealer, the Collection of over 4,000 pieces provides a fascinating insight into the civil and legal status of enslaved blacks. The New Orleans Municipal Records are an extremely valuable source of information on the work and leisure activities of the 19<sup>th</sup> century slaves and the Xavier library also holds the only surviving manuscript of official slave-auction records. Other items include plantation accounts and estate appraisals, lists of slaves, private letters and bills-of-sale documenting the importation of slaves into Louisiana from Africa. The publication of the manuscripts on microfilm ensures that the priceless information offered by this unique collection is widely available and thus provides an unparalleled opportunity for research and study into the slave trade.

## Naval Office Shipping Lists\*

1683 - 1825

The Naval Office Shipping Lists were compiled by the Naval Officers in the British Colonies in North America and the West Indies and then sent periodically by the Governor of the colony to England. The Lists give information regarding the date of entry or clearance, the name of the ship, the home port or colony, details of construction and registration, the name of the master and the owner, the tonnage and number of guns, the number of crew and, of course, details of the cargo.

## Parral Papers

1631 - 1821

This unique microfilm collection represents perhaps the most definitive historical record of the Southwestern United States and Mexico. Spanning the years 1631-1821, El Archivo de Hildalgo del Parral is a collection of official records, directives, treaties, court transcripts, wills, letters and other documents relating to the Spanish Colonial Era in "Nueva Vizcaya" - the region now including much of the southwestern United States and much of Mexico. Over 360,000 manuscript pages, written in Spanish, provide primary reference on the administration of government, Indian uprisings, slavery, public entertainment, military organization, silver mining, official residences, crime and punishment and civil law. Since the history of the Southwest is often clouded by fiction, the Parral Papers benefit serious researchers attempting to uncover accurate historical data. Included are references to Father Eusebio Koni, the accusation of Juan Mange by the Jesuits, a report on the assassination of the governor of New Mexico in 1644, plus an account of the 1720 peace treaties with the Apaches and the Texans.

## Providence Island Company, Papers\*

1630 - 1641

The Providence Island Company was founded in 1630 by a group of Puritan grandees in an attempt to confront the national enemy, Spain and begin the building of a foundation for English economic independence. Surviving papers include the records of company meetings, official and unofficial letters and reports and the diary of the last governor, Captain Nathaniel Butler. The colony failed, "extinguished" by the Spanish in 1641, but it nonetheless strengthened a strong English presence in the West Indies.

Memoirs, letter books, memoranda, plantation estimates, maps, leases and numerous waste and account books relating to the affairs of Joseph Senhouse are collected here. Senhouse resided for many years in Barbados and Dominica. Also includes the recollections of William Senhouse, the Surveyor General of Barbados and the Leeward Islands from 1770-1787.

### Anti-Slavery Collection: 18<sup>th</sup> - 19<sup>th</sup> Centuries from the Friends' House Library\*

1700 - 1900

This collection includes 37 volumes of anti-slavery tracts; a number of miscellaneous pamphlets and ephemera; the Thompson Clarkson Collection on which Thomas Clarkson based his "History of the Abolition of Slavery" published in 1808; and some rare periodicals including the "Anti-Slavery Record" and "The Friend of Africa." Also included is a complete typed chronological bibliography of the anti-slavery tracts.

### Anti-Slavery Materials: Regional Records and Other Pamphlets\*

1700 - 1899

The collection of Anti-Slavery material at the John Rylands Library is a wide-ranging and fascinating one which is of particular importance for the study of provincial philanthropic societies in England. As well as this, there are documents from Africa and many from the West Indies in addition to substantial papers concerning the American Civil War. The major part of this initial publication consists of the Wilson Anti-Slavery Collection, a large series of 19<sup>th</sup> century pamphlets donated by H.G. Wilson, the Member of Parliament for Sheffield. Much of the material is extremely rare, with a substantial emphasis on publications issued in the region - especially Birmingham, Glasgow, Leeds, Manchester and Sheffield. The American Civil War material includes items from Boston, New York, Philadelphia and The Rochester Ladies Anti-Slavery Association. A substantial West Indian series emanates from Jamaica, together with many items from throughout the Caribbean. There is also an interesting series from India.

## **Lascelles & Maxwell Letterbooks\***

1739 - 1769

Fortuitously extant letterbook of prosperous 18<sup>th</sup> century London Merchants. This small collection is of great importance to scholars of slavery and the sugar trade in Barbados and Jamaica. Also presented within this collection are the transcripts made by Richard Pares, distilling the other eleven volumes of the firm's letters, the originals of which were later destroyed by fire during the Blitz. This collection attempts to reconstruct Lascelles' and Maxwell's rich documentary store and presents one of the finest collections of colonial commercial material from 18<sup>th</sup> century London.

## **Long, Edward. Edward Long Papers\***

1734 - 1813

Edward Long went to Jamaica in 1757 where he became private secretary to his brother-in-law Sir Henry Moore (lieutenant-governor of Jamaica 1756-1762), judge of the Vice-Admiralty court and speaker of the House of Assembly. He is best known for his *History of Jamaica or a General Survey of the Ancient and Modern State of that Island...* which was published anonymously in 1774. Long's manuscripts contain correspondence, maps, genealogical and other historical material relating to the history of Jamaica. A well-known collection amongst scholars for its depth and quality in the study of slavery plantations.

## Papers of the Christian Faith Society\*

1600 - 1900

The Society originated in a bequest by Robert Boyle in 1691 for advancing religion among infidels. In 1794 the charity was reconstituted as "The Society for the Conversion and Religious Instruction and Education of the Negro Slaves in the British West-India Islands" and, in 1836 after the abolition of slavery, as "The Society for Advancing the Christian Faith in the British West-India Islands and elsewhere, in the Dioceses of Jamaica and of the Barbados and the Leeward Islands and in the Mauritius." The Society was instrumental in spreading a greater awareness of the realities of slavery during the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries

## Rhodes House Library, Oxford, Anti-Slavery Collection\*

1795 - 1880

The collection at Rhodes House, Oxford, is a major un-researched source for the history of the anti-slavery movement in the 19<sup>th</sup> century. A major part of the collection relates to the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society. The Society was founded in 1839, its aim being to secure the abolition of slavery in general and in America in particular. It convened the first world Anti-Slavery Convention in 1840 and this was followed in 1842 and 1843 by further conferences. The greater part of the archive is the extensive correspondence from the secretaries and other officials of the Society, including such important figures as Thomas Pringle, John Scoble, Benjamin Millard, John Tredgold and Louis Chamerouzow. The letters are all arranged in alphabetical order. There are other letters from leading anti-slavery campaigners, with lesser or greater connections with the Society including such luminaries as Zachary Macaulay, Thomas Clarkson and the Gurney family and an interesting group of official letters from prime ministers, government offices, etc. to officers of the several societies.

To complete the very full archive there are also account books, rough minutes, attendance registers and papers from a general collection arranged according to territory and subject. The collection also contains papers from two other organizations set up to counter the evils of slavery. The Aborigines' Protection Society was founded in 1837 and was amalgamated with the British and Foreign Anti-Slavery Society in 1909. The collection at Rhodes House includes some important Minutes and Secretaries' Correspondence, as well as papers arranged according to territory and subject. Finally, there are 14 volumes of letters received by the secretary and trustees of the Mico Charity from the superintendents and teachers of the schools that the Charity had set up. These had been established following the abolition of West Indian Slavery in 1834, in order to educate the ex-slaves and their children in a period of apprenticeship that was to serve as a preliminary to complete emancipation. The collection dates from 1835-1842 and the letters are organized by island.

1680 - 1865

This collection includes many rare examples and will prove of great value to scholars working in this field. They include T. Tryon's "Negro's complaints of their hard servitude...in the West Indies plantations" (c.1680) and W. Bosman's description of the slave trade on the Guinea Coast (1705.) Wilberforce's letter to Talleyrand (1814) and works by Ramsay, Clarkson, Macaulay, etc. are also included.

## **The Slave Trade and Abolitionism in France**

1700 - 1900

It was only "for the good of their souls" that Louis XIII authorized the French trade in African slaves in 1642. By 1656 there were 3,000 slaves in Guadeloupe; during the last quarter of the 17<sup>th</sup> century, 124,000 slaves were brought to the West Indies; and in the decade preceding the Revolution, the French captured and exported an average of 27,000 African slaves per year. The French slave trade— suspended by the Revolution, reinstated by Napoleon and permanently abolished in 1848— aroused fierce opposition and equally heated partisan defense. This collection includes rare 18<sup>th</sup> century descriptive works on the regulation of the trade and polemical works on both sides of the controversy, along with 19<sup>th</sup> century statistical surveys, accounts of the economics of the trade, descriptions of slave voyages and proceedings of official commissions.

## **Slavery Tracts and Pamphlets from the West India Committee Collection\***

1800 - 1900

The sugar trade of the West Indies and its dependence on slave labor was a highly controversial subject in 19<sup>th</sup> century England, giving rise to an extensive pamphlet literature. The collection owned by the West India Committee was described by the historian and bibliographer L.B. Ragatz as "the finest lot of pamphlets in existence" and includes many items not easily found in other public collections. There are some 350 titles in all, including pamphlets by Wilberforce, Macaulay, etc.

## Indigenous Peoples

### Bureau of American Ethnology Bulletins and Annual Reports, Smithsonian Institution

1879 - 1971

The tribal cultures, history and heritage of Native Americans are of great interest today. Yet, primary sources for exploring these topics have been meager and widely scattered. This significant microfilm collection brings together essential research resources for the study of both North and South American Indians. Libraries that serve a Native-American population and institutions supporting research in American history, anthropology or Native-American studies will discover material on the prehistory, language, society and culture of many extinct tribal groups. The collection is divided into two sections:

- **Bulletins (V. 1-200, 1887-1971):** This segment contains articles, memoirs and monographs for probing such subjects as language, native arts and industries, institutions and organizations, myths and beliefs, ethnobotany, ethnogeography, physical anthropology and archaeology
- **Annual Reports (V. 1-48, 1879/1880-1930/1931):** The first 47 reports include administrative reports, ethnological papers and monographs covering all phases of aboriginal life plus numerous archaeological surveys. The 48<sup>th</sup> report includes an index to all preceding reports. Many of these valuable publications are now out of print.

While the bulk of material in this collection focuses on the history of Indian tribes within the United States, there is substantive information on the Indian tribes of Alaska, Hawaii, Mexico, Central America, Canada, Southern Yucatan and Northern Honduras. Many of the bulletins and reports also contain line drawings and photographic illustrations and an additional feature of the collection is a complete series of handbooks on South-American Indians. The collection reproduces an important series of documents of the United States Bureau of American Ethnology under the auspices of the Smithsonian Institution.

### Harrington, John Peabody. The Papers of John Peabody Harrington in the Smithsonian Institution

1907 - 1957

John Peabody Harrington's field notes on Native-American language, culture, and history are considered one of the richest bodies of work existing in this field. After Harrington's death in 1961, scholars brought together his papers in the National Anthropological Archives of the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of Natural History. After years of effort by teams of archivists, microfilming of the papers began in 1976. The collection is comprised of field notes, slip-file dictionaries notes and drafts for published writings, photographs, sketches, correspondence, maps, and unpublished grammars and other manuscripts in various stages of completion. Overall, the collection contains more than 750,000 pages. The following is the areas related to Latin-American studies:

## Human Relations Area Files

Human Relations Area Files, Inc. (HRAF) is an internationally recognized organization in the field of cultural anthropology. Established as a not-for-profit membership consortium of universities, colleges and research institutions, HRAF's mission is to provide information that facilitates the cross-cultural study of human behavior, society and culture. HRAF grew out of work in the 1930s by behavioral scientists at the Yale University Institute of Human Relations who began development of a classification scheme for cultural information by subject. The Human Relations Area Files was incorporated in 1949 with Harvard University, the University of Oklahoma, the University of Pennsylvania, the University of Washington and Yale University as its founding members. These five were joined within the year by the University of Chicago, the University of North Carolina and the University of Southern California. Some 300 colleges, universities, libraries, museums and research institutions in the United States and 25 other countries are now Associate or Sponsoring Members.

HRAF is a financially independent research agency of Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. Since World War II, the growing concern of students, scholars and the general public around the world to understand ethnic conflict, cultural diversity and global problems has generated a demand for educational and research programs emphasizing the worldwide, comparative study of human behavior and society. The development of cross-cultural and area studies requires an extensive body of readily available organized cultural information. Scattered among myriad journals, dissertations and fieldwork studies and across numerous disciplines, conventional sources of such information are often inaccessible, expensive and difficult to utilize effectively. The HRAF collections are specifically designed to lessen these barriers to cross-cultural research.

## **Pepper, George Hubbard. George Hubbard Pepper Papers**

## **The Fondo Gerardo Barrios of the National Archive of El Salvador**

1860 - 1863

The Fondo Gerardo Barrios of the National Archive of El Salvador is the only collection that contains the correspondence of a single president. The documents, bound into large leather covered volumes, contain the letters sent and received by Barrios' correspondents during four important years. The years covered in the collection, between 1860 and 1863, were the most important in Barrios' long political and military career when he held the Presidency. In October 1863 Barrios was overthrown by a coalition of Salvadoran military officers, peasant militias and the Guatemalan army. His years in power were highly conflicted, as cross-border civil wars continued. This collection provides critical and unique insights into an important transitional period in the history of El Salvador.

## The BBC Summary of World Broadcasts

1939 - 1997

In the summer of 1939, with a world war on the horizon and many of the normal communication channels about to disappear, the British Broadcasting Corporation (BBC) began monitoring radio broadcasts in other countries. They began with five countries. Since then, monitoring has grown to include over 100 countries.

Throughout the world, the BBC continually monitors major foreign radio broadcasts from strategically placed listening posts. Transcripts of broadcasts are then edited and translated into English.

In addition to being useful for studying current global affairs, the *BBC Summary of World Broadcasts* chronicles important historical events, such as the first man in space, the invasion of Czechoslovakia, and the Chernobyl incident. Included are detailed accounts of events from different perspectives--some factual, some propaganda. These uncensored transcripts often provide critical information not available through "official" news sources.

Due to the overwhelming quantity of broadcasts, the *BBC Summary of World Broadcasts* provides a representative sample of the material monitored. Publications and topics include speeches by national leaders; military, political, economic, scientific, and cultural developments and appointments; propaganda trends, including subversion and incitement to revolt (particularly by means of "freedom stations" purporting to operate within the country addressed, but in reality outside it); and radio developments. During time of war, publications also include official war communiqués, news reports from the fronts, reports indicative of resistance activities, and news and talks giving indications of public morale.

The *BBC Summary of World Broadcasts* is available in sets organized by region, by time period, or both. Prior to 1947, all parts were grouped together into one series in *Digest of World Broadcasts* (the publication's original name). In the years that followed, groupings varied in size and number (for example, from 1947-1949, the *Summary of World Broadcasts* was divided into three parts: U.S.S.R. and Eastern Europe; Germany and Austria; and the rest of the world). Publication frequency also varied, from daily publication in 1939 to six days a week. (At times, frequency was five times a week and periodical.)

Also included is *The Monitoring Report*, a brief summary of the major items and trends of broadcasting throughout the world, which was published daily from April 1940 to January 1947 and five times a week from 1947 to November 30, 1996.
